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

# FBLA Fall Rally Notice

- Make sure that you have proper dress. You will wear your FBLA T-shirt. Your shorts must meet school dress code. Wear comfortable shoes to walk around in (tennis/running shoes, etc...)No flip flops.
- We will meet to leave from the LCHS Teacher/Senior parking lot closest to the band practice field @ 8 am.
- If you are not here on time to ride to the Fall Rally you will be left and must report to school for a normal day.
- Get breakfast **BEFORE** departure. We will not be able to stop for breakfast because of the number of people traveling.
- You **WILL NEED** money for lunch at the fair (Estimated \$10-15 depending on how much you eat)

# Fall Leadership Conference Info

The conference will be held on November 7th-8th at the Classic Center in Athens, GA. It is a wonderful experience for these young people as they participate in informative leadership workshops, hear from dynamic speakers, and play in one of the world's largest Monopoly tournaments. Most of our students will also participate in competitive events testing to prepare for Region and State competitions.

The registration fee is \$100.00 which includes the conference registration and lunch on Wednesday, conference t-shirt, hotel room and travel expenses. FBLA members should bring additional spending money for meals (Wednesday evening, Thursday breakfast, Thursday supper) as well as any personal expenditures (snacks, etc.). We are also asking that the students participate in our fundraisers in the fall and spring to help offset additional costs.

The State FBLA office moved the conference up two weeks which in turn moved our deadlines for registration up two weeks. I apologize for such short notice but we must have students registered for the conference by midnight, Tuesday, October 2nd. In order to stay in a hotel directly beside from the conference center we must turn in our initial registration by Wednesday, October 3rd.

If your student plans to attend, we are asking for a \$25 non-refundable deposit to be turned in by the end of the day on Friday, October 12th. Registration after October 10th will incur an additional \$15 Penalty charged to us by Georgia FBLA. Full Payment is NOT required Thursday but I need to know if your student plans to go. Payments can be made on the trip in installments so if you do not have \$100 up front, I can work with you. If other payment arrangements need to be

made, please let me know. Please discuss this trip over the next couple of days and feel free to contact me via text on my cell phone. The full balance of the trip (\$100) will be due Tuesday, November 6th. We will leave Wednesday at 8 am, November 7th immediately from the LCHS parking lot. We will return to the campus late Thursday evening at approximately 9 pm.

The dress code for the entire conference is professional dress. Please refer to the Dress Code agreement as it must be signed. Dress for the bus is casual. Please discuss with your student the importance of following all of the behavior and safety rules, as well as attending all of the meetings. This is a school trip and the students are responsible for their actions at all times! We will have a meeting in the coming weeks to discuss additional information about this trip.
