Hurricane Michael Causes Cancellation of Fall Motivational Rally

On October 10, 2018, our area endured an all night and following day Category 3 Hurricane. Hurricane Michael swept quickly in from the Gulf making landfall as a record-breaking Category 5 hurricane. Due to the hurricane, the damaging high winds caused FBLA along with the Georgia National Fair in Perry, Georgia to close.

With the FBLA Fall Motivational Rally scheduled for October 11th, we sat on the edge of our seats waiting and wondering if we would be able to attend. Our LCHS FBLA Chapter, along with many other stu-

dent organizations were scheduled to attend the conference where we traditionally gather and meet with other Georgia Chapters, have a dynamic motivational speaker kick-off the year, having open testing events, and fellowship through food and fun at the fair.

Unfortunately, Hurricane Michael left our area severely damaged and tens of thousands without power and many without food, shelter, or water. In some areas nearby, some were without power for nine days. Our adviser, Mrs. Amanda Overstreet and her

family was without power for seven days. She said, "at first, I was ok. It was like camping. We let up the windows, used our generator to power a lamp, the refrigerator, and a fan." Mrs. Overstreet said her days of camping were quickly drawing to become something they had never planned for. She said they had cold running water for showers and warm nights.

Although, her and her family had minimal damage, many others had extensive damage. The students were sad but understood the circumstances and refunds for the rally will be given.



There will be workshops for students to attend when not competing and an awards ceremony will be held following the completion of competition.

petition coming up in March.
