

State Leadership Conference Info

If your child has automatically qualified to attend the FBLA State Leadership Conference and Competition because of their academic success and/or participation at our recently held Region Competition. The state conference will be held on March 20-21 at the Classic Center, Athens, GA. It is a wonderful experience for these young people as they have earned the right to compete against the best students from across the state of Georgia. Our students will also participate in informative leadership workshops, hear from dynamic speakers, and play in one of the world's largest Monopoly tournaments.

Unfortunately, the travel expenses for such an amazing conference are expensive. The FBLA state office charges \$75 per student for their conference registration. In

addition, our hotel rooms are \$168 per night and we must stay two nights. We also have to pay for the registration and hotel room for our bus driver and chaperones.

Throughout the year we have been fundraising for FBLA at the school. Fundraising helps to reduce the costs of the trip for the student. FBLA members **SHOULD bring additional spending money** for meals (Sunday dinner, Monday breakfast, lunch and dinner, Tuesday breakfast and lunch) as well as any personal expenditures (snacks, etc.).

I apologize for such short notice but GA FBLA gives us a quick turn around time for Region Conference. We are registering students on Monday, February 10th. Payments can be made on the trip in installments so if you do not have \$140 up front, we can work with you. A \$75 non-refundable deposit will be

due by Monday, February 10th but you may also pay in full. If other payment arrangements need to be made, please let me know.

Please know that your student will miss school on Friday, March 20th and will return extremely late Saturday, March 21st due to many of your spring break plans beginning the following day. Additional information will be sent out in the near future. We will also have a meeting in the coming weeks to discuss the trip and any questions you may have.
